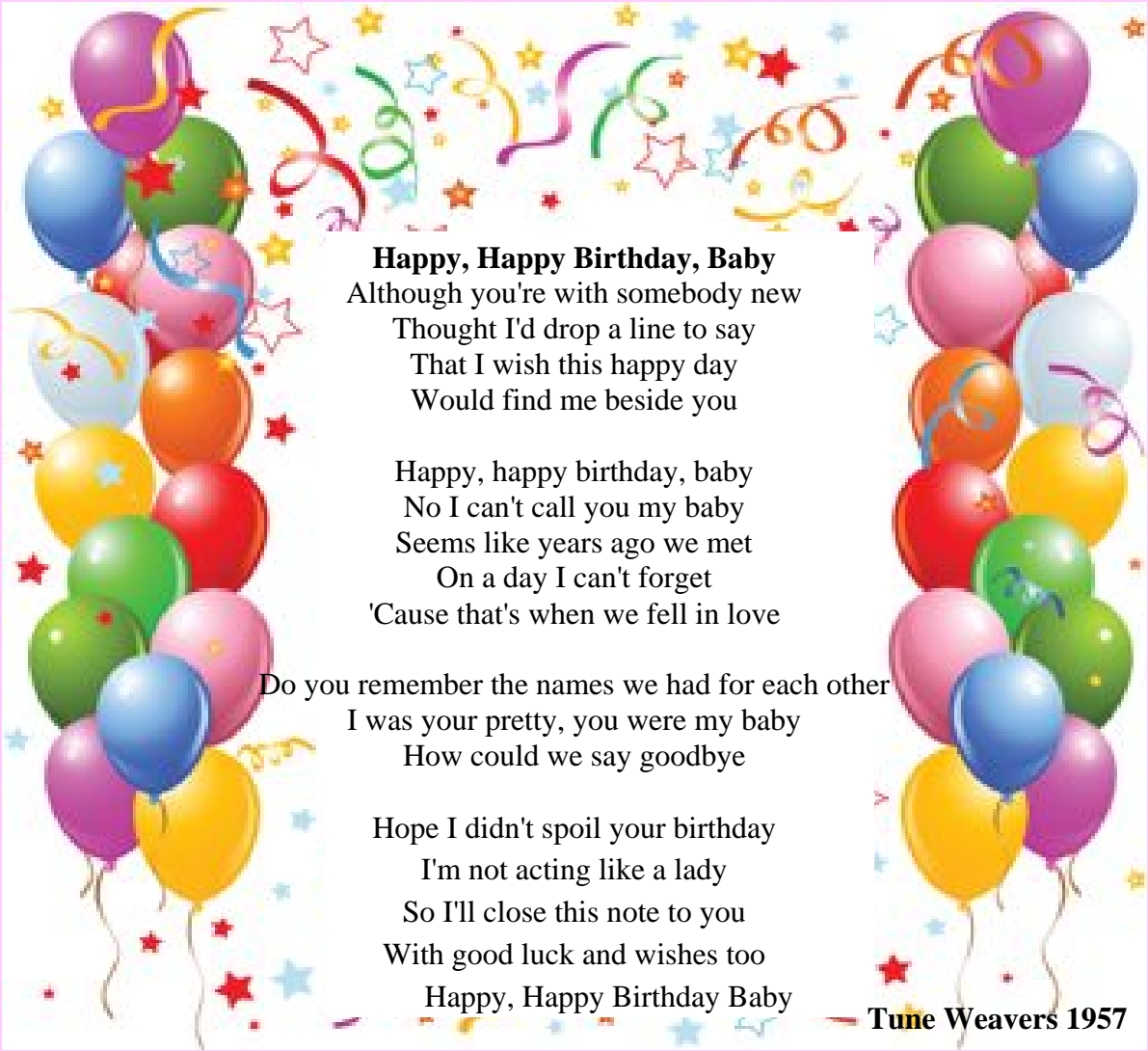
Next click on the tab that says Our Blog.

Peter J. Arnolt

Pete always had an interest in flying. While at Cornell University, he took private lessons. During his four year of college, he was part of the Reserve Officers Training Corps (ROTC) program. When he graduated in 1966, he was commissioned as a Second Lieutenant in the Army. A few weeks later he was sent to Fort Sill, Oklahoma where he made the decision to become a helicopter pilot. His advanced flight training began at Fort Walters in Texas and continued in Alabama at the U.S. Army Aviation Center at Fort Rucker. There, on June 19, 1967, while flying with his instructor “under the hood”, which is instrument flight training, Pete was killed in a mid-air crash. It was a tragic end to the life of a wonderful young man and brave soldier who had always brought great joy to his family and friends.

There is a bronze plaque in the Rose Garden in Cahoon Park with Pete’s name engraved along with others from Bay Village that died for our country in the Korean War, and Vietnam War.
