Merry Christmas and Happy New Year 2011 to you!



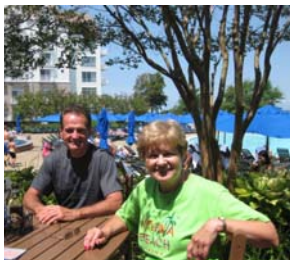
We thought we'd share with you some of our special moments and pictures from trips we took this year.

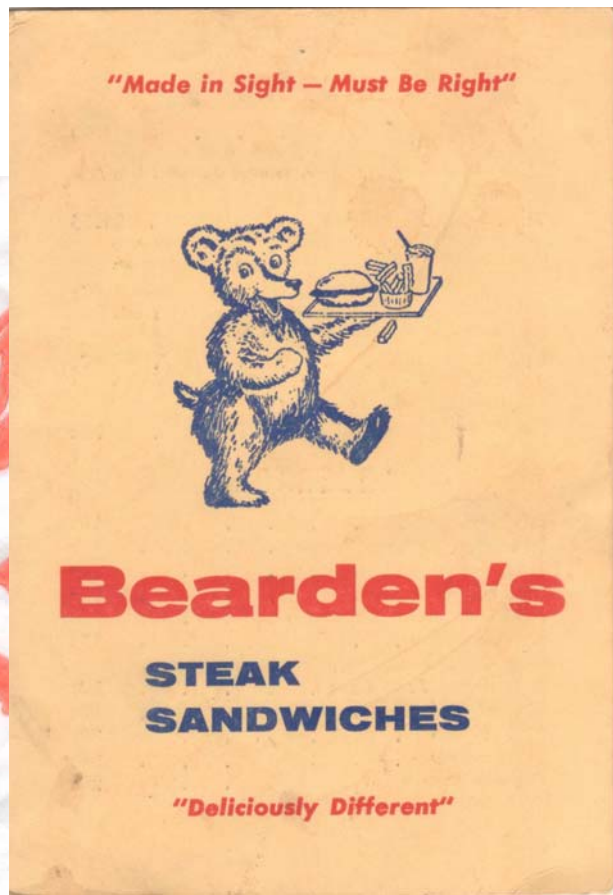


This was the crowd this past Monday at Bearden's as everyone wanted one more burger, a side of onion rings and watch the train roll down the tracks one last time.
